

Stewart refuses to allow his sons to be drafted by either governments - Washington or the Confederates. A widowed Virginian with a large family, Stewart gives several anti-state speeches, especially when confronted by soliders from the North and South, Considered a libertarian classic, "Shenandoah" shows war basically as a government struggling to take-over territory held by another government, and that people are mere tools to further the goals of the state. Like the old saying goes "Governments don't protect people, people protect governments."
